A **Walking School Bus** is a great way for kindy and primary school children to walk to and from school in a fun, safe and easy way.

What is a Walking School Bus?

A Walking School Bus is a group of students, with adult supervision, walking along a set route between their homes and school.

Children can join the Walking School Bus at points along the route, near their homes.

Children can also be taken to a collection point.

This could be a nearby park where parents drop off their children to join the Walking School Bus to school.
